Reading Diaries

The school expectation is that every child will read four (4) times at home during the week and record that in their diary.

In the diary:


Your child needs to record the name of the book when they first start it.

The pages they have read (e.g. p1-7)

Then write either a small summary (e.g. Stanley has just arrived at Camp Greenlake) of what they have read and/or a question they might have about what is going to happen next (e.g. I wonder how they are going to get out of ...?)

This can be after they have read to you or after they have read independently themselves. If they are reading independently, we recommend you just discuss with them every now and then what it is they are reading e.g. Do they like it? What has happened? What do they think is going to happen next?

You can also log bedtime reading, if you as a parent or guardian are reading to them (though this does not count towards the four times a week child lead reading unless they are sharing the reading duty with you).
